Listening	<p>30 minutes for 4 sections of about 10 questions each</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are Section 1: 10 questions (General conversation between 2 English natives) • Section 2: 10 questions (Monologue on the general topic) • Section 3: 10 questions (Conversation between 2-4 people around academics) • Section 4: 10 questions (Monologue on an academic topic) • 40 questions to be answered in 30 minutes
Speaking	<p>11-14 minutes face to face interview</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3 parts to this section • In Part 1, questions are asked on general introduction like family, home, studies, work • 4-5 minutes are allotted for Part 1 • In Part 2, test takers have to talk about a topic given through a task card • 3-4 minutes (including preparation time) test takers have to spend for Part 2 • In Part 3, the examiner will discuss issues with the test-taker related to Part 2 • 4-5 minutes are allotted for Part 3
Reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3 reading passages taken from journals, newspapers, books, or magazines. • 40 questions to be answered in 60 minutes • Mostly 11 kinds of task type will have to answer like- MCQ, Identifying information, Identifying writer's opinions, Matching information, Matching heading, Matching features, Matching sentence endings, Sentence completion, Summary or flow chart completion, Diagram label completion, and short answer questions
Writing	<p>1st task is of 150 words to write a formal commentary on a chart or table 2nd task is of 250 words for a short essay.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2 writing tasks to be completed in 60 minutes

- In IELTS Academic Writing Task 1, test takers have to visual information comprehended through the chart, diagram or graph.
- In 20 minutes, test takers have to complete IELTS Academic Writing Task 1 in 150 words
- In IELTS Academic Writing Task 2, test takers have to respond to a point of view or problem or argument from the given topic
- In 40 minutes, test takers have to complete IELTS Academic Writing Task 2 in 250 words

IELTS Academic: Score and Band Descriptors

For **IELTS listening score**, 1 raw score is added for each correct answer.

IELTS Speaking Score is dependent on **four parameters**- fluency and coherence, lexical resources, grammatical accuracy, and pronunciation.

IELTS Writing score is dependent on **four parameters** – coherence and cohesion, lexical resources, task response, and grammatical accuracy.

The meaning of each point of the IELTS band scale (Acceptable) is mentioned in the table below:

Band score	Skill level	Description
9	Expert user	The test taker has fully operational command of the language. Their use of English is appropriate, accurate and fluent, and shows complete understanding.
8	Very good user	The test taker has fully operational command of the language with only occasional unsystematic inaccuracies and inappropriate usage. They may misunderstand some things in unfamiliar situations. They handle complex and detailed argumentation well.

7	Good user	The test taker has operational command of the language, though with occasional inaccuracies, inappropriate usage and misunderstandings in some situations. They generally handle complex language well and understand detailed reasoning.
6	Competent user	The test taker has an effective command of the language despite some inaccuracies, inappropriate usage and misunderstandings. They can use and understand fairly complex language, particularly in familiar situations.
5	Modest user	The test taker has a partial command of the language and copes with overall meaning in most situations, although they are likely to make many mistakes. They should be able to handle basic communication in their own field.
4	Limited user	The test taker's basic competence is limited to familiar situations. They frequently show problems in understanding and expression. They are not able to use complex language.
3	Extremely limited user	The test taker conveys and understands only general meaning in very familiar situations. There are frequent breakdowns in communication.
2	Intermittent user	The test taker has great difficulty understanding spoken and written English.
1	Non-user	The test taker has no ability to use the language except a few isolated words.
0	Did not attempt the test	The test taker did not answer the questions.

The process of IELTS Exam:

The Listening, Reading and Writing sections of all IELTS tests are completed on the same day, with no breaks in between them. The Speaking test, however, may be scheduled up to a week before or after the other tests.
